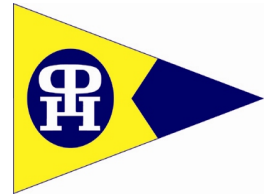

RULES:

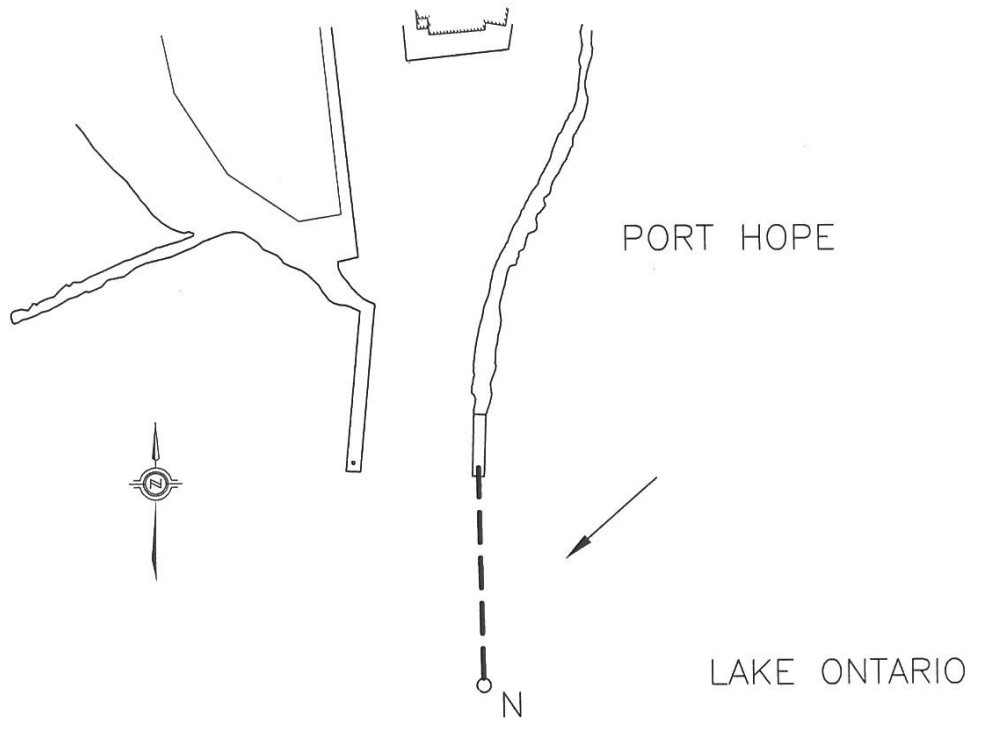

NO SPINNAKERS SHALL BE FLOWN UNTIL CROSSING THE START LINE.

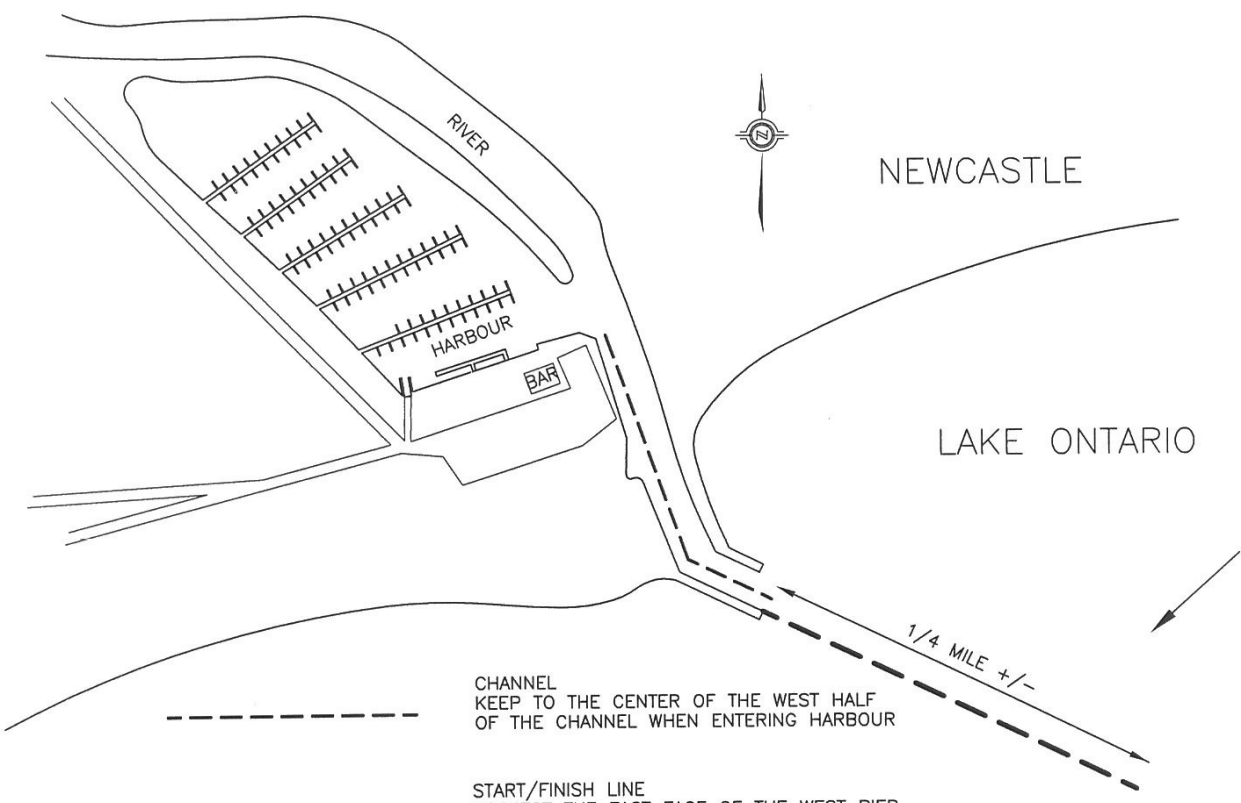
KEEP AND RECORD YOUR OWN TIMES BOTH UP AND BACK.
